SAMPLE

Required Qualifications

Education/Training

Successful completion of an ACGME or AOA accredited Residency in Internal Medicine and a fellowship in Endocrinology or foreign equivalent training.

ANIE

Current certification or active participation in the examination process leading to certification in endocrinology by the American Board of Internal Medicine or in by the American Osteopathic Board of Internal Medicine or foreign equivalent training/board.

Additional Credentialing Criteria (Initial and Reappointment)

In accordance with Hospital Sedation Policy and completion of the SHC sedation exam taken every 2 years

Use of Fluoroscopy Equipment- Valid Radiology Supervisor and Operator Certificate or

Fluoroscopy Supervisor and Operator Permit Required Teaching appointment to work in SHC outpatient clinics

Membership and privileges at LPCH to treat patients 14 years and younger

To be granted Central Venous Catheter Insertion must complete "Getting to Zero" educational module and 10 procedures within the previous 2 years - Case log required (first time request only).

Clinical Experience (Initial) .

Needle aspiration of the thyroid

Minimum of 10 cases during the past 2 years to demonstrate competence

Bone biopsy Must have done a minimum of 3 cases to demonstrate competence

Clinical Experience (Reappointment)

Minimum 22 Core cases required during the past 2 years

Minimum 3 cases each required during the past two years - Treat or provide follow-up care for

ages 14 years or younger; Needle aspiration of the thyroid; Bone biopsy
