SAMPLE

Required Qualifications

Education/Training

Successful completion of an ACGME or AOA-accredited residency in family practice or foreign equivalent training.

AND

Current certification or active participation in the examination process leading to certification in Family Medicine by the American Board of Family Medicine or in by the American Osteopathic Board of Family Physicians or foreign equivalent training/board.

OF

Documentation or attestation of the management of general medicine problems for at least 100 inpatients or outpatients as the attending physician (or senior resident) during the past two years

Additional Credentialing Criteria (Initial and Reappointment) In accordance with Hospital Sedation Policy and completion of the SHC sedation exam taken

every 2 years

Teaching appointment to work in SHC outpatient clinics

Membership and privileges at LPCH to admit, treat patients 14 years old and younger

Clinical Experience (Initial) .

Fiberoptic sigmoidoscopy - 10 cases for each privilege selected in the past two years - documentation required

with biopsy; Cervix - biopsy; Cervix -

cryocautery; Colposcopy; Hemorrhoidal rubber banding; Newborn circumcision

Clinical Experience (Reappointment)

Minimum 25 Core cases required during the past 2 years

Minimum 10 cases for each privilege selected required during the past 2 years - Fiberoptic sigmoidoscopy - with biopsy; Cervix - biopsy; Cervix - cryocautery; Colposcopy; Hemorrhoidal

rubber banding; Newborn circumcision
