	Required Qualifications
Education/Training	Successful completion of an ACGME or AOA-accredited residency/fellowship in pediatrics or foreign equivalent training.
	AND
	Current certification or active participation in the examination process leading to certification in Pediatrics by the American Board of Pediatrics or by the American Osteopathic Board of Pediatrics or foreign equivalent training/board.
	AND
	Documentation or attestation of the management of at least 25 pediatric (0-18) inpatients or outpatients as the attending physician (or senior resident), during the past two years.
Additional Credentialing Criteria (Initial and	In accordance with Hospital Sedation Policy and completion of the SHC sedation exam taken every 2 years
Reappointment)	To be granted Central Venous Catheter Insertion must complete "Getting to Zero" educational module. 10 procedures within the previous 2 years - Case log required (Initial only)
Clinical Experience (Reappointment)	Minimum 10 Core cases required during the past 2 years
FPPE	FPPE CRITERIA LISTED BELOW. FPPE WILL BE ASSIGNED BY THE SERVICE CHIEF DURING THE APPROVAL PROCESS
	5 Chart Reviews -provider must meet with proctor to discuss completed cases/charts - Core; Administration of Moderate
	3 chart reviews - Central Venous Catheter Insertion
