## Required Qualifications

**Education/Training** 

Successful completion of an ACGME or AOA-accredited residency/fellowship in pulmonary

medicine or foreign equivalent training.

AND

Current certification or active participation in the examination process leading to certification in Pulmonary Disease by the American Board of Internal Medicine or the American Osteopathic Board of Internal Medicine or foreign equivalent training/board.

Additional Credentialing Criteria (Initial and Reappointment)

In accordance with Hospital Sedation Policy and completion of the SHC sedation exam taken every 2 years

Use of Fluoroscopy Equipment- Valid Radiology Supervisor and Operator Certificate or Fluoroscopy Supervisor and Operator Permit Required

Teaching appointment to work in SHC outpatient clinics

Membership and privileges at LPCH to admit, treat patients 14 years old and younger

To be granted Central Venous Catheter Insertion must complete "Getting to Zero" educational module. Minimum of 10 cases done in the past two years. Case log required (Initial only)

Clinical Experience (Initial) .

Thoracostomy tube placement

Must have received formal training in tube thoracostomy. Minimum 10 cases required - must

submit documentation log

Rigid Bronchoscopy; Endobronchial Tumor Ablation; Laser Bronchoscopy 10 procedures for each priivlege selected within the previous 2 years - Case log required

Clinical Experience (Reappointment)

Minimum 100 Core cases required during the past 2 years

Minimum 6 cases required during the past two years - Thoracostomy tube placement

Minimum 5 cases required for each privilege selected in the past two years - Rigid Bronchoscopy;

Endobronchial Tumor Ablation; Laser Bronchoscopy
