	Neurointerventional radiology - Neuroradiology fellowship or practicing in neurointerventional radiology and done a minimum of 150 cases in the past two years.
	Diagnostic and therapeutic general angiography and vascular interventions - One yr special training or practicing in diagnostic and therapeutic general angiography and done a minimum of 150 cases in the past two years.
	Nonvascular interventional procedures - One yr special training or practicing in nonvascular interventional procedures and done a minimum of 150 cases in the past two years
	Carotid Stenting - Documentation of completion of 40 arteriograms and 25 carotid stent procedures. All must be proctored by Active Medical Staff member who has met above requirements.
