# Notice: Planned Power Shutdown to Occur Saturday, June 21, 2014

In order to modernize the electrical distribution systems that support Stanford Hospital & Clinics, a scheduled electrical shutdown will occur on Saturday, June 21, 2014 impacting all levels of Stanford Hospital's Phase 1 building at 300 Pasteur Drive.


The work will modernize the electrical systems that support Stanford Hospital & Clinics. The upgrades will improve the overall safety and reliability of the electrical system and minimize the risk of unplanned power interruptions in the future.

# Electrical Shutdown: Saturday, June 21, 2014

The shutdown will begin at 6:00 a.m. Normal power is scheduled to resume at 10:00 p.m. on Saturday.

All floors (Ground Level through Fourth Level) will be affected by the shutdown. See the map included for the shutdown area.

# Why is an electrical shutdown occurring at Stanford Hospital?

The electrical shutdown is occurring in order to modernize the electrical systems that support Stanford Hospital & Clinics. The upgrades will improve the overall safety and reliability of the electrical system and minimize the risk of unplanned power interruptions in the future.

# How long will the shutdown last?

The shutdown will begin at 6:00 a.m. and will last 16 hours. Normal power is scheduled to resume at 10 p.m.

# Impacts to the Entire Hospital

• SHC Cafeteria will be closed: LPCH Cafeteria will be open and food trucks will be available at the Fountain Entrance.

# Emergency Contact for Staff

Will it affect my care? / Is it unsafe for me to be receiving care from the hospital at this time? No. Stanford Hospital has emergency power protocols that support patient care areas in the event of power shutdowns, both planned and unplanned. Staff, departments and facility crews spent many weeks collaborating and planning for this event.

#### Is this an emergency?

No, this is a planned power shutdown that is scheduled to improve our electrical system.

• The ATM near the ED will lose power. Some vending machines on the First and Second Floor will also lose power.
